Seeing outline and internal edges Blind, partial blind, and pure contour drawing

Seeing and form, Fast drawing to capture the essence of the object

Shading: scribbling (random lines), Hatch and x-hatch, Pointillism Shading, light, 3d form, solids, tonal blending
